Baran: As you know, I personally enjoy caring about people and also because of its variety, being in a close communication with individuals, even taking their temperature and tell how they feel.




Kimia: So, you can find all of these as a doctor.




Baran: Yeah. And also she's known as the "Lady with the Lamp".

Baran: Yes. She always spent her time carrying a lamp in hand at midnight to take care of patients during the war. She was regarded as an angel.




Baran: She never married and spent her life time on training perfect nurses.

Kimia: That's a difficult choice she made!



The windows were broken yesterday. (Passive sentence)

Example

All people use public transportation every day. (Active sentence) Public transportation is used every day. (Passive sentence)

If we want to say who has done the action, we use «by» at the end of the sentence.

Example

Public transportation is used every day (by people).

The windows were broken yesterday (by children).



You know them, they are all around us—those people who are always *complaining*¹ and seeing the glass as half empty, rather than half full. We may have to deal with them, but we certainly don't want to be around them if we don't have to. When we leave their presence we may feel tired or depressed. What are their habits? First; nothing fills them, even if they get something they want. It seems like they have an <code>insatiable²</code> appetite³. They just never feel full. When you are in their <code>company¹</code>, you feel a sense that you "<code>owe⁵</code>" them something, and you can't quite put a finger on what that is. Second; anger is an emotion that they easily go to. They are either complaining about something that happened in the past, or finding <code>fault⁶</code> with what's going on in the present. You feel like you have to watch your every word when you are around them. Third; there is no one, in their opinion, who has had it worse off than them. They can make up story after story for you. If you seriously listen to their scenarios, and try to help, you can't. They simply don't want to change, no matter what you do. These people are so <code>wrapped up²</code> in themselves; there is no room for your feelings and needs. They are too busy thinking about themselves and their next moves.

Question tags can either be;

If we already know the answer we use falling intonation.

Falling Intonation

- 1 have told you not to run, haven't I? (Mother telling her son after her son falls.)

In a falling intonation the speaker is actually very confident and sort of asking the person to confirm or agree with what he / she is saying.

Rising Intonation 1

- 2 Jack paid for the dinner, didn't he? (I hope he paid for the dinner... did he?)
- 3 You told her I wasn't going to the party, didn't you? (Did you forget to tell her?)

In a rising intonation the speaker is not as confident of his / her statement and he / she is asking the other person to find out about it.



ACE NEWS



Florence Nightingale was a trailblazing figure in nursing who greatly affected 19th- and 20th-century policies around proper care. She was known for her night rounds to aid the wounded, establishing her image as the 'Lady with the Lamp.' Florence Nightingale was born in Florence, Italy, on May 12, 1820. Part of a wealthy family, Nightingale defied the expectations of the time and pursued what she saw as her God-given calling of nursing. During the Crimean War, she and a team of nurses improved the unsanitary conditions at a British base hospital, greatly reducing the death count. Her writings sparked worldwide health care reform, and in 1860 she established St. Thomas' Hospital and the Nightingale Training School for Nurses. A revered hero of her time, she died on August 13, 1910, in London.



Abbas Babaei

Martyrs remains alive in people's hearts.

Martyr Abbas Babaei was a fighter whose moments of life were full of ups and downs and tumultuous waves. He was a virtuous man whose soul was filled with love, selflessness and generosity; a soldier who was a brave veteran of battlefields. Martyr Babaei was born in 1950 in Qazvin city. He accomplished his elementary and high school in Qazvin and entered the Air Force Pilot School in 1969. When he passed the basic courses, he left for the United States of America in order to complete pilotage courses there.

According to the rules of the college, Babaei had to live with an American roommate for two months. His roommate stressed "Babaei is a reserved and isolated person, and indifferent to customs and social norms. His behavior actually indicates his negative stance against Western culture; he is strongly committed to the traditional culture of Iran". During his services in Isfahan Air Base, he was given a promotion and was assigned the rank of colonel on November 30, 1983. He became the operation deputy commander of the Air Force and was transferred to Tehran.He fought selflessly with lots of sacrifices during the years of the Iran-Iraq war at the fronts of the battlefield He successfully launched 60 military operations only from 1985 until the time of his martyrdom. Major General Babaei was appointed as the brigadier general on April 28, 1987. While returning back from an overseas mission, General Babaei, the operation deputy commander of the Islamic Republic of Iran's Air Force, was targeted by an anti-aircraft missile and fell martyr.

World Kindness Day is celebrated annually on 13th November. On this day, participants attempt to make the world a better place by celebrating and promoting good deeds and pledging acts of kindness, either as individuals or as organizations. World Kindness Day was first launched in 1998 by The World Kindness Movement, an organization formed at a 1997 Tokyo conference of like-minded kindness organizations from around the world. There are currently over 28 nations involved in The World Kindness Movement. Likewise, on Kindness Day everyone is encouraged to make a similar declaration. Donating books, food or clothes to your local community is a great way to



celebrate. However, pledging to commit just one act of kindness is no less worthwhile: hold the door open for a stranger, compliment your neighbour on their collection of garden gnomes, and let your partner have control of the TV remote for the evening.

Effect of kindness

Abraham Joshua Heschel a philosopher/theologian, wrote: When I was young, I valued clever people. Now that I am old, I value kind people.

We humans flourish when treated with kindness, and this becomes even more true as we age. With less time ahead of us than behind us, the need for a less complicated, kinder life replaces the need for those external signs of success (the big house; the new car...) that were so important to us in earlier years. Showing kindness doesn't cost anything or even take much time. Kindness can be as simple as a warm smile; a touch; or a word of encouragement.

"A strong correlation exists between the well-being, happiness, and health of people who are kind," says Professor Stephen Post, author of *Why Good Things Happen to Good People*. "It's difficult to be



angry, resentful, or fearful when one is showing unselfish love towards another person."

Research also shows that people who are kind and compassionate have better general health and live longer, as do the people on the receiving end of their kindness. Children do better in school, and people with an injury or illness heal more quickly when they are treated with kindness.

Kindness is universal, understood by people of all ages and cultures. And it even goes beyond conventional sensory and communication pathways. As the author, Mark Twain wrote: Kindness is the language which the deaf can hear and the blind can see.

Who is who -

Jabbar Baghcheban

Mr. Baghcheban was inventor of teaching method to deaf people in Iran, founder of



pre-school education and a pioneer in culture and literature of children. He was born in Yerevan city (Caucasus state) in 1885. He invented oral hand alphabet system, which is unique of its kind in the world. This system is based on the characteristics of sounds and words. In this alphabet, unlike other types, person uses only one hand. During his life with implementation of deaf teacher education, schools, especial schools, colleges, training classes were established. Finally this great man expired on 25 November 1966. God bless him.

Hassan Omidzadeh

Mr. Omidzadeh was a teacher who saved 30 students when the class was burning in



flames. Hassan Omidzadeh was a teacher from Shaft, Guilan. In the February of 1997, the school where he was teaching caught fire. The devoted teacher showed great boldness to save 30 students, where he himself was burnt severely in the face and around his head. Omidzadeh brought the students out one by one when the door was closed and he had to struggle a lot to take himself out of the room. After suffering the injuries for years, he died on July 18, 2012 in Fuman General Hospital.

Riz-Ali Khajavi

Azbar-Ali Hajavi, also known as Riz-Ali Khajavi, who bravely saved the lives of



passengers from a train crash in 1961 died at 86 on Saturday. Born in 1930, in Miyaneh, northwestern Iran, Riz-Ali is best known as Dehqan-e Fadakar. For decades his story was taught in primary schools nationwide. On a cold November night, Khajavi, 32, detected a landslide while walking along the railroad. He then took off his jacket tied it to a stick and set it on fire while running towards a train which was speeding towards him shouting danger to stop it. He finally was forced to fire his gun into the air to stop the train.
